MOSES EINSTEIN (2)

since 1850 merchant in Kinston (North Carolina USA), later Goldsboro (A) born 12 Dec 1829 Ederheim, died between 1900 and 1910 in Cincinnati (Ohio) (parents = Loew Einstein + wife Sara nee Bock) (B)

married before 1857

HELEN

born ca 1836 Grand Duchy of Baden, died between 1910 and 1920 in Cincinnati (parents = ?)

CHILDREN (all born in North Carolina):

(01) LEVI (also called Lee)

born 1857 in North Carolina (Kinston or Goldsboro) died after 1930 (unknown when and where), married Barbara NN, born ca 1867 in Ohio, her parents being of German origin (couple lived in Cincinnati in 1900, later in Boston, Massachusetts, both died after 1930, no children) Levi was a butcher

(02) SOLOMON (also called Sol)

born 1860 in North Carolina (Kinston or Goldsboro) died between 1910 and 1920 in Cincinnati, Ohio married Mathilda NN, born ca 1870 in Ohio, her parents being of German origin (couple lived in Cincinnati, Ohio), Mathilda may have died or remarried between 1920 and 1930

children:

- (a) Elsa, born ca 1891 in Ohio
- (b) Jean, born ca 1893 in North Carolina, lived with her mother in 1920 in Cincinnati
- (c) Lionel, born 20 Jan 1895 in North Carolina, no more in 1920 census, may have died before (he was a travelling salesman und appeared at the draft registration 1917/18 for World War I)

(03) SARA

born 1871 in North Carolina (Kinston or Goldsboro) lived with her brother Solomon's family in 1900 and 1910 (still unmarried) in Cincinnati

(A) Moses Einstein lived in 1850 together with his brothers Zadoc, Abraham and Simon in a hotel in Kingston, Wayne County, North Carolina USA. The 1870 + 1880 census mentions Moses Einstein as living in Goldsboro. The Kinston Journal mentions the "Einstein brothers" in 1879, also "Oettinger & Einstein" as Jewish merchants. The 1900 census mentions Moses Einstein and his wife

Helen as living with son Solomon's family in Cincinnati, Hamilton County USA.

(B) Loew Einstein emigrated to the USA after his wife Sara nee Bock had died in 1852. He still lived there in 1856, his death date and place is unknown.
